<u>Overview:</u> Exploring various characteristics of plants as related to sight, smell, and taste.

Precautions:

1. Sensory sensitivities to touch, smell, taste

Completion Time: 45 minutes

Materials: (10 participants)

- 1. Cuttings from various plants with notable sensory characteristics. (see list below for possible choices)
- 2. Brown lunch bags (number to match each variety of plant cuttings)
- 3. List of descriptive words for visual, olfactory, and tactile senses. (optional) (see below for examples)
- 4. Marker (1) (optional)
- 5. Paper or white board (optional)
- 6. Pens (10), pencil (10) or white board marker (1)
- 7. Cups (optional) (10)
- 8. Pitcher of water (optional) (1)

Pre-Session Prep:

- 1. Make cuttings of plant material
- 2. Set separate tasting cuttings aside
- 3. Number each brown bag with one bag/number for each plant cutting.
- 4. Place each plant into a brown bag
- 5. Put tasting cuttings in separate bag
- 6. Print off descriptive word lists
- 7. Collect pens and paper if that is going to be used during discussion

Step-By-Step Process/Instructions:

- 1. Talk with participants about using senses in the garden and with each plant they encounter.
- 2. Start with each participant exploring a bag through touch without looking at it; record impressions/descriptions, either each person on paper or on white board for the entire group.
- 3. Explore the same bags as in step 2 by smelling and recording impressions.
- 4. Explore each plant sample through visual exploration by taking the plants out of the bag and talking about what they look like.
- 5. Remove plants from the bag one by one; discuss the names of each plant.
- 6. Remove all plants from the area so they do not get mixed up with the next step.
- 7. Present tasting cuttings; discuss possible likes/dislikes; taste as desired and record impressions.
- 8. Offer water between tastings as desired.

Tips:

- 1. Possible Plants Choices for Cuttings:
- Mint (smell, taste)
- Basil (smell, taste)
- Rosemary (smell, taste)
- Oregano (smell, taste)
- Thyme (smell, taste)

- Lemon Thyme (smell, taste)
- Lemon Balm (smell, taste)
- Lavender (smell)
- Kale (taste)
- Honeysuckle (smell, taste)
- Parsley (smell, taste)
- Cilantro (smell, taste)
- Fragrant flowers in bloom (smell) check for poisonous status
- Azalea leaves (touch) POISONOUS do not taste
- Hosta leaves (touch)
- Lamb's ear (touch)
- Non-fragrant flowers in bloom (sight) check for poisonous status
